CONDITIONS:

1. All students who have been provisionally selected as per the list should ensure that a letter of acceptance of the selection is received at the address above by 12 Noon on 5th July 2010 by letter, email or fax.
2. Registration will start at 9.00 a.m. on Friday 9th July 2010 in the Scudder Auditorium, CMC, Bagayam, Vellore – 2. All selected candidates are required to submit the following certificates in ORIGINAL for registering for admission to the Course :
 - (a) Mark/Grade Sheet of the qualifying examination
 - (b) Pass Certificate of the qualifying examination
 - (c) Course Certificate of the qualifying examination
 - (d) Date of Birth Certificate
 - (e) Community Certificate if applicable
 - (f) Transfer Certificate
 - (g) Migration Certificate
 - (h) Four passport sized colour photographs
3. The candidates who cannot produce the original certificates may be given additional time with prior permission only, after giving the letter of acceptance. **Please note that the candidates will not be registered without the Original Certificates listed above.**
4. Candidates are required to pay Tuition and Hostel Fees for the first year of the course at the time of acceptance and registration.
5. All foreign passport holders will be admitted subject to submitting all the items listed under 3 (a) to (h) and 4 only if NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE is obtained from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare of the Government of India not later than 15th September 2010, failing which the provisional selection will be withdrawn.
6. Failure to fulfil any of the above conditions will lead to forfeiture of the seat.
7. Classes begin on Saturday 10th July 2010 at 8.00 a.m.
8. All candidates should execute a **service obligation agreement** with the college, which will be given to them.
9. All candidates and their parent / guardian should sign an undertaking to abide by the rules and regulations of the College.
